

Unprecedented progress against neglected tropical diseases, WHO reports

The World Health Organization (WHO) has announced unprecedented progress against neglected tropical diseases (NTDs) in the 10 years since a group of global partners agreed to address the problem. NTDs targeted include Dengue, Rabies, Trachoma, Buruli ulcer, Yaws, Leprosy, Chagas disease, Leishmaniases, Taeniasis neurocysticercosis, Dracunculiasis, and Echinococcosis. Foodborne trematodiases, Lymphatic filariasis, Mycetoma, Onchocerciasis (river blindness), Schistosomiasis. According to the WHO, 70% of countries and territories that report NTDs are low or lower-middle income economies. The report listed providing access to care and medicines (especially chemical prophylaxis) as key achievements. In 2015 alone, the WHO estimated that 1 billion people were treated for at least one NTD. 


