

Microbiologist of the Month Melinda Ashcroft

Postdoctural Research Fellow in Microbial Genomics ASM Communications Ambassador

I entered university through a pathway for the disadvantaged as I grew up in a poor household. I believe there should be more federal funds allocated to help support transitioning into tertiary education for those from low socio-economic backgrounds. I can cook a perfect mediumrare steak as I ended up as a grill cook for seven years before coming back to study and getting my Masters in Biotechnology.

My transition into Microbiology was somewhat accidental. I was originally working in Melanoma genetics during my Masters, however realised that I did not want to work in a traditional wet lab environment and so I took an Introduction to Bioinformatics and Genomics course. This led to a Masters project co-supervised

by Associate Professor Scott Beatson who works in Microbial Genomics. Following this

I was offered a summer internship in Scott's lab working on *E. coli* genomics and from there transitioned into a Microbial Genomics PhD. This was quite difficult because I had limited microbiology or bioinformatics experience and thus had a massive learning curve. But 4 years later I submitted my PhD and have been working as a Postdoctoral Research Fellow in Microbial Genomics (first at the University of Queensland and now at the Peter Doherty Institute) ever since.

I love my work in Microbiology. I am learning every day and I feel that my work makes a real difference in people's lives as I work on antimicrobial resistance in bacterial pathogens with clinical relevance. Previously I worked on *E. coli* that cause urinary tract infections, one of the most common infections worldwide. Currently I work on investigating the drivers of the Gonorrhoea epidemic, looking at ways to reduce incidence and antimicrobial resistance, with more of a public health focus.

Visiting Speaker Program A/Prof Petar Knezevic


-Event Report-

The Visiting Speakers Program welcomed Associate Professor Petar Knezevic from the University of Novi Sad on Monday the 21st of October 2019 at Swinburne University. A/Prof Petar had travelled to Australia to present at the Westmead Institute for Medical Research and proceeded to present as a VSP in Melbourne, Adelaide and Perth. Petar's seminar for the Victorian Branch was entitled "Bacteriophage-Antibiotic Synergy" based on the progress and current research in the bacteriophage field.

A/Prof Petar is an associate professor in Microbiology in the Faculty of Science and a member of the International Committee on Taxonomy of Viruses where he is a chair for the family Inoviridae. Petar's seminar gave an overview of the relationship between bacteriophages and antibiotics detailing how the combination of the two can aid in combating multidrug resistant bacteria. Additionally, Petar gave an insight into how some combinations of bacteriophage and antibiotic may not aid in the treatment of bacterial infections.

We had a range of attendees on the night from University of Melbourne, La Trobe University and Swinburne University, with a mixture of both postgraduate students and post-doctoral researchers. A special thank you Prof. Enzo Palombo for hosting A/Prof Knezevic for the ASM Vic Branch's VSP.






ASM Vic Branch Christmas Party 2019 -Event Report-
