2020 ASM Nancy Millis Student Awards Event Report


The annual ASM Nancy Millis Student Awards were held at RMIT University (city campus) on Tuesday 25 February 2020. The evening was chaired by Assoc. Prof. Karena Waller (University of Melbourne). The evening commenced with light refreshments before the presentation of thirteen undergraduate prizes for top achieving microbiology students studying at various Victorian universities, including Monash University, RMIT University, La Trobe University (Bundoora and Bendigo campuses) and the University of Melbourne. Each of the undergraduate prizes consisted of a certificate, a cheque and a year's student membership to the ASM.

The evening continued with presentations from the recipients of this year's ASM VIC Branch Summer Student Research Awards. Jay Law (La Trobe University), Adeleine Chew (University of Melbourne) and Irena Jovanovska (Swinburne University of Technology) each delivered short presentations summarising their research experience project and findings. Two presentations from research students competing in the categories of ASM VIC Branch Award (for Honours and Masters by Coursework students) then followed. Adrianna Turner (Doherty Institute/University of Melbourne) presented "Defining the Prevalence and Molecular Mechanisms of Daptomycin Resistance in Enterococcus faecium" and Ashleigh Rogers (Monash University) presented "Host recovery following Clostridioides difficile infection". Following deliberations by the judges, the ASM VIC Branch Award was awarded to Ashleigh Rogers (Monash University; pictured below). As the winner of this prize, Ashleigh will receive a prize consisting of registration at the Annual Meeting in Melbourne (July 2020).

Six speakers, Marina Zupan (Doherty Institute/University of Melbourne), Zahra Islam (Monash University), Jiyao Gan (Hudson Institute/University of Melbourne), Marion Bichet (Monash University), Laura Ellett (Doherty Institute/University of Melbourne) and Aurelie Tsee (La Trobe University) competed for the prestigious ASM Nancy Millis Student Award, and a prize consisting of registration (and an oral presentation) at the ASM Annual Meeting in Melbourne (July 2020). The winner of this prize was Marion Bichet (pictured below), who presented *"Phage adsorption and inactivation by the Eukaryotic cell could have repercussions for the efficacy of phage therapy."*

The evening concluded with drinks and a delicious supper prepared by Pearson and Murphy Catering (RMIT University, city campus). Overall, it was a fabulous night for Microbiology! Over 100 people enjoyed the evening's activities.

Congratulations to all students who competed for prizes on the night – their research presentations were outstanding!

Microbiologist of the Month

Cathy Hannant

I am a Medical Hospital Scientist at a major Metropolitan Hospital in Melbourne. My journey began as a student loving biology at school and progressing into a Bachelor degree in Science at the University of Queensland with a major in Microbiology.

I had an interest in industrial Microbiology at University, but my interested quickly changed with my first job at the Respiratory Investigation Unit at Prince Charles Hospital, participating in Cystic Fibrosis microbiology. Over the years I have moved from NT, ACT, and then country Victoria and now Melbourne, probably being employed in 15 different institutions, mostly public but some in the private sector. I worked in a variety of departments, mostly microbiology, occasionally biochemistry, haematology, blood banking, core laboratory and a very short stink at a STD clinic lab. The longest stint was 22 years in the one institution (which included a merger). So my interests have varied and were heavily governed by the diagnostic microbiology of my current institution.



Meanwhile our profession was continually changing and much of my energy was expended adapting to the changing workface, the knowledge required not just to be a "jack of all trades" but an experienced scientist. I have been heard to say "How many ways are there to do a tube coagulase?" I ended up fascinated by why this is so.

I loved mechanisation, and followed by computerisation, and being a creative soul, I enjoyed my 10 years being involved in LIS scripting. I love problem solving and have a drive to improve myself and what is happening around me. I enjoyed being an auditor.

I have experienced many frustrations and rewards, in my career. My position in the profession today probably reflects some of my life choices and priorities, and I am contented. I also started my career at a time when Diagnostic Laboratories were expanding, and this is reflected by the number of people of my age group in this profession.

My current passion is to share some of my experience and hand over something to the next generation. Over my career, professional reading, has always been the hardest and often most isolated tasks I needed to perform. With the modern IT tools that we have today, there is no need for some of these tasks to be so onerous on the individual. Currently I am organising a Journal club at my institution to encourage and help my work colleges to have fun, set up a regular routine of reading and share the workload involved.

My message to future Medical diagnostic scientists is: not to be complacent, keep yourself up to date, make the jobs you do distinctly yours, and undertake it with expertise, create a demand that cannot be replaced by automation, or expertise from above or below. Survival of our profession depends on adaption, innovation, and scientific leadership in staying ahead of change.
